## Subject Awards

For each subject there will be the opportunity to for students to receive either the subject award, distinction award or a merit award. The winners of the awards are chosen by the staff that teach and administer each subject. Please note the following criteria to guide your selections:

Covid-19 has caused disruption in 2020 and meant that some students were not able to complete all Term One assessment, especially exams. No student will be penalised for missing assessment and decisions will be made on these awards based on completed assessment only.

## Subject Award (1 award per subject):

Awarded to the student who receives the highest mark in the year level for a subject In the event of a tie it is at the discretion of staff who is the winner, but a winner needs to be selected.

Year 12 subject awards will be awarded in 2021 at the first Mega Chapel of the year to the students with the highest score in the subject.

## Distinction Award (1 award per subject and 2 awards for Year 12):

Awarded to the student who receives the second highest mark for a year level for a subject. In the event of a tie it is at the discretion of staff who is the winner, but a winner needs to be selected.

Year 12 Distinction awards will be given to the top two students as determined by their results at the end of Term Three. There may be a tie in which case more Distinction awards may be awarded.

## Merit Award:

Awarded to the student/s that in the opinion of staff are deserving of recognition for their efforts and/or performance in the subject. It does not have to be based on results. Rather it can be based on achieving to the best of their ability.

There is a limit of one award per class, with a maximum of 4 per year level per subject. For instance, if there are four General Maths classes then four merit awards can be given, but where there is one Specialist Maths class it is one merit award.

These awards are not compulsory and some subjects with small numbers may choose to not award them.
