

STUDENT PATHWAY (Figure A)

Foundation

A chance for students to experience different sports and see what takes their interest. Often, we utilise external providers like Auskick, Redcliffe Touch, Northside Wizards etc.

We make use of external providers to give our early years students and their parents easy access to a variety of sporting opportunities

Participation

Facilitated through our own internal programs; students get access to a range of opportunities through Primary Classics (Year 3 – 4) and weekly Interschool Sport (Year 5 – 12) whereby the focus is participation and creating opportunities for all students to be involved.

Primary Classics

Our Secondary Students coach small groups of students through training and games to help them develop their skill and grow the community.

Interschool Sport

During the week students (Year 5 – 12) partake in timetabled sport activities. We compete against the local schools in our district (Redcliffe District for Primary, South District for Secondary) in a variety of sports in a home/away format.

Carnivals

- » **Cross Country Carnival (Prep - Year 12)** This carnival is one of our most unique sporting events of the year as it incorporates a real festival feel to the athletic proceedings. In addition to donning their house colours, students are marked with house coloured zinc, treated to live music and finish the event with a delicious morning tea. Apart from all the festivities the carnival is still about cross country running and all participants are cheered on by parents and peers alike. The results from the Cross Country are used to select the top 6 students to make the Mueller College cross country squad who compete at district and Christian Schools (CSSAQ) carnivals.
- » **Athletics Carnival (Year 3 - 12)** This carnival is one of the pinnacles of the school year where both competitive and non- competitive athletes have an opportunity to participate in various athletic disciplines. The results from the Athletics Carnival are used to form the Mueller College athletics team that competes at the district carnivals and Christian Schools (CSSAQ) for Primary only.
- » **Swimming Carnival (Year 3 - 12)** The Swimming Carnival is a fantastic opportunity for students to participate in a variety of competitive and novelty swimming events. During all our sporting carnivals friendly house rivalry is encouraged as students compete for the prestigious House Shield and other individual accolades. The results collated from this carnival are used to determine the top 2 students from each event for the Mueller College swimming squad who compete at a district level and in Christian Schools (Primary Only) swimming carnivals. These students then have the opportunity to go on and be selected for regional, state or nationals. Apart from the traditional swimming strokes a number of novelty events happen to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to have some fun in the pool.

Performance

Extracurricular sport at Mueller is where a large amount of development takes place. Committing to one training session per week is essential to develop both the skill and character of students who chose this pathway.

- » **Extra-Curricular Sport** Extra-curricular sport at Mueller requires commitment to at least one season of training once per week and playing games once per week. Trials take place prior to the season and where numbers allow a 1st and 2nd team per age group are selected.

Pinnacle

The pinnacle sporting experiences within our programs are the highlight for the students involved. Often combining performance with culture; these competitions are a way for the students to test themselves against the best in the state.



PARENT/ALUMNI PATHWAY

Volunteer

We encourage parents to join the Mueller Sport Community in a variety of ways at all levels of our sport programs. Be sure to reach out to our Head of Sport to register your interest.

Manager

Managers are able to assist generally with game day operations such as student supervision, roll marking, jersey collection etc.

Assistant Coach

Assistant coaches will help the Head Coach with preparing sessions, covering absence and can provide additional feedback to players.

Head Coach

Head Coaches lead the management/development of the players in their team whilst taking direction from the Academy Coordinator or Head of Sport.

BASKETBALL ACADEMY

Aims & Values

Since its foundation in 2013 as the first Mueller Sport academy, the Mueller Basketball Academy (MBA) has been committed to producing student-athletes of skill and character.

The MBA prioritises the comprehensive development of its athletes by emphasising the advancement of basketball specific skills, game intelligence, character building, and an enthusiasm for lifelong learning grounded in the foundations of the Gospel and the Mueller Sport mission of **Building Athletes, Growing Community**.

The Mueller Basketball Academy defining characteristics that we aim to embody and exemplify on and off the court are **Hustle & Heart**.

Preseason

The MBA preseason begins with trials in mid-Term 1. Upon selection to the Academy students and coaches begin preseason conditioning and practice activities. A highlight of the preseason is the Mueller Basketball Academy camp where students share in community through training, playing practice games, and participating in an intra-academy tournament.

Season

The Basketball Academy season begins in Term 2 with teams competing in the Brisbane Outer Schools League (BOSL) competition. BOSL is a club quality competition against schools on the northside of Brisbane played at local stadiums with qualified officials. The competition runs most of the term with finals being held in weeks 9 and 10 depending on age group and division. Students in Year 7-10 also compete in the Christian Schools Sport Association Queensland (CSSAQ) Basketball 1-day tournament in Term 2 against other Christian schools across South-East Queensland.

Champion Basketball School of Queensland Tournament (CBSQ)

Students in the Academy are reselected at the end of the BOSL season to compete in the CBSQ Tournaments held by Basketball Queensland. These tournaments are the pinnacle of the MBA experience.

Aims & Values

Mueller Touch Academy began in 2017. We started with a humble 4 teams, 1 teacher, 2 volunteer coaches, 8 footies, and no resources. Fast forward to today and we now have a Touch Football Australia endorsed program from Year 1-12, that is both year-long programmed and club integrated.

The Academy exists to: 'Build Athletes & Grow Community'. We build athletes in both skill and character. We grow community through gather and reform. With the Gospel as our foundation, Mueller Touch Academy has four pillars. Two for building athletes (1, 2) and two for growing community (3, 4).

1. Skill

Through touch academy, students will become complete and adaptable athletes by following the 7step process.

7 steps: Learn the skill, well, at speed, under fatigue, & under pressure, in competition conditions, consistently.

2. Character

Through touch academy, students will become complete and adaptable humans by embracing the traits 'hard & humble'.

Hard: the ability to keep going when you don't want to

Humble: thinking less about yourself and more about the good of others

3. Gather

Through touch academy, people from all walks of life will gather together, forming meaningful friendships that last beyond their time in the academy.

Friendship: the chief happiness of life

4. Reform

Through touch academy, we will reform systems and structures through simple service.

Serve: take from myself to give to others

Our big goal is to become a QLD Top10 Touch School. While we place much importance on excellence and rankings, we believe building athletes in character is the most generous service we can provide our players. Building athletes in skill (touch football) is a vehicle by which we can help players harness and mould both the common and unique parts of their own person into its most attractive and life-giving form. This service of character formation provides our players something far greater and further reaching than any level of touch football skills attained. Personal character is what each player will live or die by in every sphere of life, post their schooling journey.
